THE OPEN 133cms GOLD CUP

(Section A) DRESSAGE (Section B) COMBINED WSP

(Section C) SHOW JUMPING

Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 133cms.

Riders not to have attained their 14th birthday before 1st January in the current year

YOU MUST BE A CURRENT BSPS MEMBER TO ENTER THIS CLASS.

Class 2:

THE OPEN 143cms GOLD CUP

(Section A) DRESSAGE (Section B) COMBINED WSP

(Section C) SHOW JUMPING

Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 133cms and not exceeding 143cms

Riders not to have attained their 17th birthday before 1st January in the current year

YOU MUST BE A CURRENT BSPS MEMBER TO ENTER THIS CLASS.

Class 3:

THE OPEN 153cms GOLD CUP

(Section A) DRESSAGE (Section B) COMBINED WSP

(Section C) SHOW JUMPING

Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 143cms and not exceeding 153cms

Riders not to have attained their 20th birthday before 1st January in the current year

YOU MUST BE A CURRENT BSPS MEMBER TO ENTER THIS CLASS.

Class 4:

THE OPEN INTERMEDIATE GOLD CUP

(Section A) DRESSAGE (Section B) COMBINED WSP

(Section C) SHOW JUMPING

Mare or Gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms and not exceeding 158cms

Riders not to have attained their 25th birthday before 1st January in the current year

THIS CLASS IS NOT A QUALIFIER FOR THE BURGHLEY GOLD CUP COMPETITION.

METHOD OF JUDGING
THE BSPS GOLD CUP SPORTS PONY FINAL

To be run in accordance with the BSPS Rules for Combined & Gold Cup.

Competitors must compete in Sections A, B and C.

Marks attained in Section A – Dressage and Section B- WSP, shall be added together.

Any penalties incurred in Section C – Jumping will be deducted from the total of Section A and B.

The winner of the combined class will then be the one with the highest remaining score.

In the event of a tie or ties, the highest dressage score will determine the winner, if there is still equality the highest WSP style mark followed by the fastest show jumping time will determine the winner.

SECTION A – DRESSAGE

Pony Club 100 Eventing Test 2015

Copies are downloadable from The Pony Club website and for sale for Areas that are running events.

After completing the Dressage competitors will be allowed a short time in the collecting ring to change bridles and warm up for the WSP section.

SECTION B – WORKING SPORTS PONY

Judge: Miss Polly Mallender

ANY SUITABLE BRIDLE. MARTINGALES ARE PERMITTED

Body protectors must be worn for this section.

Maximum Height of Fences - OPEN HEIGHT

The Course will consist of a mixture of Rustic WHP and Cross-Country style fences, water may be included.

Ponies will be awarded a Mark out of 10 for their gallop.

The Marks for the gallop may be displayed.

MARKING

Jumping	60 MARKS
Style and Manners while jumping	20 MARKS
Gallop	10 MARKS
Position of Seat and Effectiveness of Rider	10 MARKS
TOTAL	100 MARKS

PENALTIES

Knock down	10 penalties
First Refusal	15 penalties
Second Refusal	20 penalties
Third Refusal	Elimination
Fall of Pony or Rider	Elimination

An elimination in this section will result in 150 points being deducted from the total score.

WSP - scores lower than 20 regardless of combined placing will not go forward to show jumping.

SECTION C – SHOW JUMPING

Judge: Mr David Andrews

ANY SUITABLE BRIDLE. MARTINGALES ARE PERMITTED

Body protectors must be worn for this section.

The Jumping section will be judged on one round, over coloured and/ or rustic fences. There will be an optimum time for the course and penalties will be incurred for exceeding this time.

There will be an alternative Fence and a BONUS MARK OF 10 will be awarded to competitors who successfully jump the alternative fence.

The competitor with the lowest score will jump first.

PENALTIES

Knock Down	10 penalties
First Refusal	15 penalties
Second Refusal	20 penalties
Knock Down Alternative Fence	20 penalties
Third Refusal	Elimination
Fall of Pony or rider	Elimination

SECTION C will be a jumping course. Joker fence to be added for Open
Any penalties incurred in Section C will be deducted from the total points of Sections A and B.

In the event of elimination in Section C 100 penalty points will be deducted from the competitors score carried forward from Sections A, B and C.
Anyone eliminated in S/J will not come forward for overall rosette.
No rider will be allowed to ride more than one pony per section.

Class 5:

LEAD REIN WORKING SPORTS PONY

Ponies not exceeding 122cms.

Suitable to be ridden by a rider born in 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017.

In Lead Rein WSP classes the Judges will be looking for a pony suitable for a child to begin their future in Working Sports Pony classes.

METHOD OF JUDGING

THE BSPS GOLD CUP LEAD REIN WORKING SPORTS PONY

Ponies will enter the ring at the walk, they may be trotted altogether at the Judges' discretion. They will be pulled into line and asked to perform an individual test around obstacles including jumping a maximum of three small upright fences not exceeding 30cms. No spread fences. Water will not be included. Ponies will not be asked to walk on artificial material e.g. plastic sheeting during the test. Riders will not be asked to dismount.

Ponies must be plaited.

The Leader must be 16 years old or over and may only lead one pony in a class. The rein **MUST** go directly from the bit to the rider's hand, with no extra aids or attachments to or on the saddle.

Handles on saddles are permitted but the reins must not be attached to the handle or to the saddle. The Lead Rein must be affixed to the noseband on which it must remain while the pony is in the ring.

Whilst in the ring ponies must always be led by the leader.

The Leader should lead on the near side with the lead rein in the left hand.

DRESS CODE

RIDERS - Hats in accordance with BSPS Rules, Tweed Jackets, Beige or cream jodhpurs, Shirt, tie, boots and gloves. **Body protectors must be worn by all riders.**

No Buttonholes.

LEADERS Country attire, Gentlemen Trilby Hats or Caps, Ladies modest hats.

PONIES MUST BE PLAITED

MARKS

Manners and Style whilst performing the test

(including jumping) 60 Marks

Type and Way of Going 20 Marks

Suitability of pony for the rider 20 Mark

TOTAL 100 MARKS

Judges will penalise refusals, knockdowns or taking the wrong course.

A stride or two of canter over the fences will not be penalised.

There will be NO conformation marks.

THE HIGHEST PLACED PONY NOT ALREADY QUALIFIED IN THE WORKING SPORTS PONY LEAD REIN CLASS TO QUALIFY FOR THE WHITE COMPANY BURGHLEY WORKING SPORTS PONY LEAD REIN FINAL ON SEPTEMBER 5TH 2021.

! Please read:

All ponies must be 4 years old or over.

Rosettes to 5th place in all classes.

Whilst NOT competing.

Please remain in your lorry/car.

You will have to create your own number.

You will be contacted prior to the show with your allocated number.

Only 3 people per horse/pony are allowed at the show.

No spectators or members of the general public allowed.

Rules and conditions

This show is affiliated to the BSPS and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in the BSPS classes whether or not members of the BSPS are subject to the constitution and rules of the BSPS including disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS.

Neither the BSPS Area 3B committee, nor any of its officers, servants or assistants shall be responsible or accountable for any loss, injury or damage to any person, animal or property in connection with this show.

Each exhibitor shall abide by and accept as final the decision of the judges, referees, chief steward and officials of the show.

The judges in the schedule have accepted our invitation to judge, but the committee reserve the right to appoint substitutes if necessary.

No exhibitor may knowingly show a pony under a judge in circumstances that would constitute a breach of rule 486 by the judge.

Any pony taking part in classes judged under BSPS rules will be liable to dope testing.

No Refund of entries will be made, except in the event of unforeseen cancellation of the show, when a £7 levy per entry will be made to cover administration costs.

In all classes correctly secured British Standard skull caps/Riding Hats that meet current safety standards MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted.

Body protectors must be worn for sections B&C of each class and for all riders of class 5 - Lead Rein Working Sports Pony.

Entries at this show are limited to 10 per class.

Entries will be open from Thursday 15th April to Friday 30th April.

Entries are £60 per class 1-4 and £45 for class 5.

Please provide your email address, your mobile phone number and any vehicle registrations that will be attending the show that associate with you (clients cars)! If you do not, then the vehicle will not be allowed to enter the event.

A timetable will be produced once the entries are closed - there will be specific times for each class and very specific working in times.

Do NOT arrive any sooner than 1 hour before your class, this allows plenty of time to tack up and warm up.

Once you have finished your class please return to your lorry and leave the centre.

British Show Pony Society

Guidelines for exhibitors/members at shows

- The society expects each member/exhibitor to take personal responsibility for not spreading the Covid-19 virus and obeying all rules regarding social distancing.

Failure to do so will result in removal from the showground.

Please do not attend if you are classified as being in a vulnerable category as per government guidelines.

Events will only take place when government guidelines allows them to do so.

- **DO NOT attend if you are displaying any signs on the Coronavirus symptoms.**

- Social distance from members other than your family group by 2 metres (or current government guidelines).
- Must use hand sanitisers on regular basis.
- Wash hands thoroughly on arrival and after using any facilities throughout the day.
- Use lorry toilets where possible to minimise the risk.
- Obey orders given by loudspeaker system regarding social distancing.
- Wear face coverings wherever possible to avoid spreading the virus.
- Temperature checks MAY be taken during the show.
- Ensure you arrive in the designated vehicle on your entry and be prepared to give names of occupants on arrival at the Show.
- Ensure you park lorries and cars safely where directed by the officials.
- Abide by the Rules in the Schedule.
- Only animals competing at the show will be allowed on the showground.
- Show Organisers have taken responsibility to set safeguards in place for exhibitors but attendance at the Show is at your own risk.
